



Friday, November 9, 2007, marked the 69th anniversary of the night SS troops and marauding civilians unleashed a firestorm of terror against the Jewish population of Germany and parts of Austria. Jewish homes were destroyed; and 8,000 Jewish shops, towns and villages were ransacked. Streets were covered with shattered glass—thus, the name by which history recalls that attack—"Night of Broken Glass" or *Kristallnacht*. Some 30,000 Jewish men were taken to concentration camps; 1,668 synagogues were attacked; and 267 synagogues were set on fire.



In remembrance of that tragedy, the Grace Covenant congregation gathered with community friends Sunday afternoon, November 11 to view and discuss Nashville Public Television's documentary, *Living On: Tennesseans Remembering the Holocaust*. Oak Ridge resident Mira Kimmelman, one of those featured in the documentary and author of *Echoes from the Holocaust: A Memoir* and *Life Beyond the Holocaust*, was present to speak of her own experience and share in a dialogue.
